




Altar Flowers

Feeding Our Children attending John M. Clayton Elementary School



In delivering leftover food items to the John M. Clayton Elementary School in Frankford from the White Bag Summer Lunch program, it was brought to our attention that there is a need to provide additional food items for days when children are NOT attending school. This includes weekends, holiday vacation days, etc. Items to consider donating include kid-friendly, nonperishable items, such as:

- Lunch items in pop-top or easy-open containers (spaghetti, ravioli, mac-n-cheese, soup).
- Fruit or applesauce in a cup, dried fruit in a bag.
- Cereal in a cup or small box, Pop Tarts.
- Granola bars or protein bars.
- Peanut butter crackers, Goldfish, etc.
- Cookies, chips, or other snacks in small bags.
- Plastic bottle or boxes of juice.

A separate tub for these food items is located outside the Food Pantry in Luther Hall. If more convenient, cash donations are most welcome.
